Raise the Roof

Regent Square Community Shows Support for Wilkins School

On the night of Saturday, April 14th, Regent Square residents came together to support the Wilkins School Community Center in a night of eating, music, and fundraising. More than 100 residents assembled at the Center to raise \$4,000 toward WSCC's roof repairs.

The evening kicked off with a hearty pasta dinner, cooked and served by community volunteers. Supporters ate and browsed the many prizes up for auction that had been donated by area businesses and individuals. Children took part in kids-only activities, including a session of "Music Together," an internationally recognized early childhood program that operates out of the community center. The opening musical act, The Regent Squares, performed a variety of crowd-pleasing folk songs, while the event headliner, Nine Mile Run, brought the evening to a close with high-energy bluegrass. Dozens of bidders went home with prizes ranging from gift certificates to artwork and even a tour of Google's Pittsburgh office. The spirit of generosity that drove the event was highlighted by the night's 50-50 raffle winner who anonymously chose to donate his winnings back to the Wilkins School.

The WSCC Board of Directors extends its thanks to all who contributed to the event and made it a huge success. The efforts of the organizers, volunteers, prize donors, and performers created a memorable night. The generosity of the event's attendees ensured that the Wilkins School building will continue to serve the community into the future. Rep. Paul Costa also added to the effort by earmarking additional state funds to the project. ■
